Jesus is the best example to follow when it comes to serving. He sets the standard for the importance and responsibility of each person who responds to the call of salvation.

For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many. — Mark 10:45

Christian service is:

 A Spiritual service – it is only done with the help of the Holy Spirit; it has divine and eternal purposes. And when it is done, it renders glory to God.



For truly, I say to you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you belong to Christ will by no means lose his reward. - Mark 9:41

- Instructed by Jesus Serving is a duty and responsibility of every Christian. It is an integral part of the spiritual growth and development of the Christian.
- A reflection of God in us it demonstrates what God has provided to us to help build His kingdom.

The bible teaches that faith is accompanied by works. If there are no works, faith is dead ...

What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? 15 If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, 16 and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what good[a] is that? 17 So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead. – James 2:14-17

...And if faith is dead, we cannot please God.

And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. – Hebrews 11:6

The Parable of the Talents

The parable of the talents illustrates the investment that God makes in each human being and what He expects of us.

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"For it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted to them his property. ¹⁵ To one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. – Mathew 25:14,15.



What can we learn from this parable?

We are all servants of God

We work for the same Lord. His name is Jesus. The ministries, capacities, and talents that we have should be done in UNITY with the same mind and purpose: to glorify God and save souls. In the church there is no place for competition or "lone rangers."

Every person receives something from God (capacity, gift, talent, etc.)

The image of God in us is accompanied by gifts and abilities that are activated by the power of the Holy Spirit in the life of each believer.

God Works with us on a personal level because we are all different

Some received five, others three, others one according to the capacity that God determines. Our responsibility is to take what we have and multiply it; put it to work; invest it so that it produces interest for the Master Jesus.

There will be a day to give an account to God

What we do for God does not save us or make us better Christians. Salvation is a free gift from God; but every Christian has a personal responsibility to "produce something" for God. A life filled with faith is a life occupied in the things of God.

Discover how God has formed me

God has been shaping you and your ministry since you were born. In fact, God began to give exclusive shape, even before you were born.

I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; my soul knows it very well. – Psalms 139:14



My MINISTRY is determined by how God has formed me. This includes various factors:

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; ⁵ and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; ⁶ and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. ⁷ To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. 1 Cor. 12:4-7

1. What is my spiritual gift?

"... But each has his own gift from God, one of one kind and one of another. 1 Corinthians 7:7

2. What am I equipped to do?

And I have filled him with the Spirit of God, with ability and intelligence, with knowledge and all craftsmanship – Exodus 31:3



3. What do I love and enjoy doing?

I delight to do your will, O my God; your law is within my heart." - Psalms 40:8

For it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure. - Philippians 2:13

4. What natural abilities do I have?

He has filled them with skill to do every sort of work done by an engraver or by a designer or by an embroiderer in blue and purple and scarlet yarns and fine twined linen, or by a weaver—by any sort of workman or skilled designer. — Exodus 35:35

5. Consider your life experiences - examine your past and present


Your testimony, past experiences, your successes. What are your dreams and desires?

The Shape God gives us is made up of several Factors:

Spiritual Gifts – What has God given you to serve? (communication, helping others, leadership, technical, etc.)

Heart – What do you love doing? These are things you are naturally inclined to do; things that catch your attention.

Abilities – Natural talents, vocational skills learned.



Personality – How does my personality help me serve others? (Am I introverted or extroverted; love to serve; always friendly outgoing, etc.)

Experiences – what personal experiences you may have had that may help others? (education/academic, ministry, painful experiences, etc.)

CLASS EXERCISE:

SPIRITUAL FORMATION

The Bible does not lock us into tight restrictions as to the number of spiritual gifts or even their definitions. The four major lists of gifts are found in Romans 12:3-8, 1 Cor. 12:1-11, 27 -31, Eph. 4:11-12, and 1 Peter 4:9-11, and there are other passages that mention or illustrate gifts not included in these lists. One person can have many gifts.

This list can serve as a helpful guideline, giving us ideas about the kinds of gifts God gives...The key is to find the areas in which the Holy Spirit seems to supernaturally empower your service to others.



Instructions: As you read through this list, prayerfully consider if the biblical definition for each of the gifts describes you. Remember, you can have more than one gift, but everyone has at least one.

Develop your Gift and Capacity

We generally serve / minister in three directions:

To the Lord Acts 13:2

To Believers Hebrews 6:10

To Non-believers Colossians 4:5-6

Three ways God desires for you to use your gifts

- Through a consistent ministry
- Through short-term projects
- Through spontaneous needs / upon request

We usually minister to people in three areas:

Physical needs

For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, 36 I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me.'... And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.' *Matthew 25:35-36, 40*

Emotional needs

And we urge you, brothers, admonish the idle, encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with them all. 1 Thessalonians 5:14





Spiritual needs

All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation. *2 Corinthians 5:18*

Defining three categories of ministries within the church

<u>Ministries from the Altar</u> – they are the ministries visible from the front of a congregation. They include: pastors, preachers, worshipers, teachers, deacons, ushers, prophets, prayer intercessors, choirs, drama actors, etc.

<u>Ministries of Groups</u> – the ministries that are in direct contact with groups of people. They include: men's, women's, youth, children's ministry, home visitation, home groups, ushers, deacons, etc.

<u>Ministries of Helps</u> – ministries that take place in the church without much "visibility." They include: home prayer intercessors, carpenters, technologies, administrators, hospitality, cleaning, assistants, etc.

Serving Others

Every person that God saves is important to Him. Each person's character is shaped by God through his relationship with God; the study of his word; academic studies; relationships we have with each other; life experiences, etc.

"To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. 8 For to one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, 10 to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. 11 All these are



empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills." – 1 Corinthians 12:7-11

We all have the duty to serve so that the Kingdom of God grows and souls are reached and transformed into children of God.

The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. - 2 Peter 3:9

We are formed by God to serve ("good works")

For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them. – Ephesians 2:10

We all have "a work" to do ...

If the whole body were an eye, where would be the sense of hearing? If the whole body were an ear, where would be the sense of smell? 18 But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. 19 If all were a single member, where would the body be? 20 As it is, there are many parts, yet one body. 21 The eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you," nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." 22 On the contrary, the parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable – 1 Corinthians 12:17-22
